II. Newcomers Benefits and Funding

Interim Federal Health Program

Multigenerational Home Renovation Tax Credit

A refundable credit to assist with the cost of renovating to establish a secondary unit that enables a senior or disabled adult to live with a qualifying relative.

Resettlement Assistance Program

Provides income support and assistance for a range of immediate essential services, such as temporary accommodation upon arriving in Canada, life skills training, assistance in finding permanent housing, and more. Call Immigration and Citizenship Canada at 1-888-242-2100 to learn more.

III. General Questions & Answers

Who can newcomers turn to if they need help with an issue?

- To start, if you are currently part of a program for newcomers, ask your peers and the
 program coordinators for advice on who can help. There is a good chance one of
 them has dealt with the same issue, so this can be a great way to find support.
- Your MLA and MP's offices can connect you to resources, provide information, and help advocate for you. See the last page of this document for their contact info.

Where can I take free English classes?

If you're a permanent resident or a protected person, you can take language classes at no cost. They are funded by the government.

These classes are called:

- Language Instruction for Newcomers to Canada (LINC)
- Cours de langue pour les immigrants au Canada (CLIC)

To take a language class:

- Visit an organization that helps newcomers get a formal language assessment

What resources are there to help my prepare for my citizenship test?

Neighbourhood houses, community organizations for immigrants, and libraries offer programs and resources to help your prepare. You can also find an online practice tests here and here.

Are there meal programs to help newcomers get more affordable food?

Many neighbourhood houses run food programs. These can include weekly meals, groceries, and community fridges. While low-cost membership with the neighbourhood house is usually required for full access, often a community fridge will be open to all members of the public.

Churches and other community organizations also offer drop-in meal programs too. The City of Vancouver's emergency meal map is a good resource to look at: wancouver.ca/files/cov/emergency-meal-program-map.pdf.

IV. Government Services
